- the movement of large numbers of people, birds or animals from one place to another
  - seasonal migration
  - mass migrations
  - the migration routes of birds
- the fact of changing from one computer system to another; the act of moving programs, etc. from one computer system to another

- The decline of the rural economy has caused urban migration.
- changes in the migration routes of reindeer
- migration from rural to urban areas
- the forced migration of African slaves
- the great waves of migration that took Europeans to the New World
- the seasonal migration of birds
