  - Companies must be able to survive in the marketplace.
  - the education marketplace
2. (*also* ,**market 'square**) *countable* an open area in a town where a market is held

- We are working hard to enter the global marketplace.
- Companies must be able to survive in what is becoming a highly competitive marketplace.
- The bomb exploded in a busy marketplace, killing six people.
