Word Origin:late Middle English: from Old French **revivre** or late Latin **revivere** from Latin **re-** 'back' + **vivere** 'live'.Example Bank:

- Attempts to revive her failed and she was dead on arrival at the hospital.
- Banks and businesses are quickly reviving business activities in China.
- The good harvest helped revive the economic fortunes of the country.
- They are trying to revive some of the old customs.
- They revived him with cold water.
- an initiative aimed at reviving talks on the country's political future
- attempts to revive falling sales
- the country's readiness to help revive the economic fortunes of its neighbours

1. **[transitive]** to bring something back after it has not been used or has not existed for a period of time:

Local people have decided to revive this centuries-old tradition.

2. **[intransitive and transitive]** to become healthy and strong again, or to make someone or something healthy and strong again ⇨

The economy is beginning to revive.

an attempt to revive the steel industry

The doctors revived her with injections of glucose.

3. **[transitive]** to produce a play again after it has not been performed for a long time:

A London theatre has decided to revive the 1950s musical 'In Town'.
