Word Origin:

Middle English (in the sense 'cauldron'): from Old French *estuve* (related to *estuver* 'heat in steam'), probably based on Greek *tuphos* 'smoke, steam'. The noun sense (mid 18th cent.) is directly from the verb (dating from late Middle English).

Idioms: ↑get be in a stew ▪ ↑let somebody stew in their own juice

verb

1. *transitive, intransitive* ~ (sth) to cook sth slowly, or allow sth to cook slowly, in liquid in a closed dish

- stewed apples
- The meat needs to stew for two hours.

- I've been stewing over the problem for a while.
- Leave him to stew.

1. [uncountable and countable] a hot meal made by cooking meat and vegetables slowly in liquid for a long time **SYN** *casserole*:

- a pot of stew
- beef stew

2. in a **stew** *informal* confused or worried about a difficult situation you are in

II. **stew**² *BrE* ⁿ *AmE* ⁿ *verb*

1. [transitive] to cook something slowly in liquid:

- stewed apples

2. **let somebody stew** *informal* (also **let somebody stew in their own juice**) to leave someone to suffer the unpleasant results of their own actions instead of helping them:

- Let him stew – I'm not going to help him.
