1. **uncountable** the act of making sth look larger
 - The insects were examined under magnification.
2. **countable, uncountable** the degree to which sth is made to look larger, the degree to which sth is able to make things look larger
 - a magnification of 10 times the actual size
 - **high/low magnification**
 - The telescope has a magnification of 50.

1. **[uncountable]** the process of making something look bigger than it is
 - at high/low etc magnification**
 - When viewed at high magnification it is clear that the crystals are quite different.
 - greater levels of magnification
 - under magnification**
 - The colour is evident even under low magnification.
2. **[countable]** the degree to which something is able to make things look bigger:
 - binoculars with a magnification of x12 (=which make things look 12 times as big)
