2. **not before noun ~ (to do sth)** having the practical knowledge or skills to do sth
 - I don't know much about it, so I don't feel qualified to comment.
3. **usually before noun (of approval, support, etc.)** limited in some way
 - The plan was given only qualified support.
 - The project was only a **qualified success**.
 - It was met with qualified enthusiasm.

adverbs

- **well qualified** As a former footballer, he is well qualified to talk about the game.
- **highly qualified** All the other applicants seemed highly qualified.
- **suitably qualified** If we can find a suitably qualified person, we'll start straight away.
- **eminently qualified** He is eminently qualified for the role.
- **ideally qualified** His former wife is ideally qualified to comment on his character.

COLLOCATIONS (for Meaning 2)

adverbs

- **highly qualified** The pilots who fly these planes are highly qualified.
- **suitably/properly qualified** Make sure that the therapist is properly qualified.
- **fully qualified** He was a fully qualified engineer.
- **professionally qualified** All our staff are professionally qualified.
- **medically/legally qualified** Decisions about such measures must rest with medically qualified personnel.
- **newly qualified** How much is a newly qualified nurse paid?

nouns

- **a qualified doctor/teacher/accountant etc** After seven years of training, she is now a qualified doctor.
