1. **countable** a small piece of jewellery with a part that is pushed through a hole in your ear, nose, etc
 - diamond studs
2. **countable** a small round piece of metal that is attached to the surface of sth, especially for decoration
 - a leather jacket with studs on the back
3. **countable, usually plural** (*BrE*) one of several small metal or plastic objects that are fixed to the bottom part of a [↑]football boot or running shoe
 - compare** [↑]cleat
4. **countable** a small metal object used in the past for fastening a [↑]collar onto a shirt
 - see also** [↑]press stud
5. **countable, uncountable** an animal, especially a horse, that is kept for breeding; a place where animals, especially horses, are kept for breeding
 - a stud farm
 - The horse was retired from racing and **put out to stud** (= kept for breeding) .
6. **countable** (*informal*) a man who has many sexual partners and who is thought to be sexually attractive
