Word Origin:

Old English (as a preposition, also in the sense 'before in time, previously'): of Germanic origin; related to Dutch *voor* and German *vor*. The adjective and noun represent the prefix **↑fore-** used independently (late 15th cent.).

Idioms: **↑bring something to the fore** ▪ **↑to the fore**

adjective only before noun (technical)

located at the front of a ship, an aircraft or an animal

compare **↑aft**, **↑hind**

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adverb

1. at or towards the front of a ship or an aircraft
compare **↑aft**
2. **Fore!** used in the game of **↑golf** to warn people that they are in the path of a ball that you are hitting
