  - Queen Elizabeth **came/succeeded to the throne** in 1952.

  - Prince Charles is **next in line to the British throne** .

Word Origin:  
 Middle English: from Old French **trone**, via Latin from Greek **thronos** 'elevated seat'.

- Example Bank:
- Elizabeth I came to the throne in 1558.
  - Left-wing revolutionaries toppled the king from his throne.
  - Queen Victoria remained on the throne for over sixty years.
  - The managing director's secretary is the real power behind the throne.
  - The marriage failed to produce an heir to the throne.
  - The prince is second in line to the throne behind his brother.
  - a claimant to the vacant Spanish throne
  - He sat very upright in his chair, as if he were a king on his throne.
