1. **intransitive, transitive** to add a number to itself a particular number of times
  - The children are already learning to multiply and divide.
  - ~ **A by B** 2 multiplied by 4 is/equals/makes 8 (2×4 = 8)
  - ~ **A and B (together)** Multiply 2 and 6 together and you get 12.
2. **intransitive, transitive** to increase or make sth increase very much in number or amount
  - Our problems have multiplied since last year.
  - ~ **sth** Cigarette smoking multiplies the risk of cancer.
3. **intransitive, transitive (biology)** to reproduce in large numbers; to make sth do this
  - Rabbits multiply rapidly.
  - ~ **sth** It is possible to multiply these bacteria in the laboratory.

## THESAURUS

### ■ different ways of calculating

• **add** to put two or more numbers together to find the total: If you add 7 and 5, you get 12.

• **subtract/take away** to reduce one number by another number. **take something away** sounds more informal than **subtract**: If you subtract 12 from 15, you get 3.

• **multiply** to add a number to itself a particular number of times: 4 multiplied by 10 is 40.

• **divide** to calculate how many times one number contains another number: 10 divided by 2 equals 5.
