Word Origin:

Middle English: via Old French from Latin *confirmatio(n)-*, from *confirmare* 'make firm, establish' from *con-* 'together' + *firmare* 'strengthen'.

Example Bank:

- Practically every new piece of documentary evidence provides additional confirmation that the charges are true.
- She nodded in confirmation.
- The police are seeking independent confirmation of certain details of the story.
- We need confirmation in writing before we can send your order out.
- Written confirmation came three days later.
- I'm still waiting for confirmation of the test results.
- You will receive written confirmation of our decision in the next few days.
