- 1. interim can be used or accepted for a short time only, until something or someone final can be made or found:
 - an interim report
 - He received an interim payment of £10,000.
 - An interim government was established.
- 2. **interim period** the period of time between two events:
 - During the interim period, air quality has deteriorated.
