1. an opening in a wall or fence that can be closed by a gate
 - They turned through the gateway on the left.
 - a fine 18th century brick gateway
2. **usually singular ~ to/into...** a place through which you can go to reach another larger place
 - Perth, the gateway to Western Australia
3. **usually singular ~ to sth** a means of getting or achieving sth
 - A good education is the gateway to success.
 - Increasingly our role is as a gateway to information.
4. (**computing**) a device that connects two computer networks that cannot be connected in any other way
