ham·burg·er [hamburger hamburgers] *BrE* [ˈhæmbɜːrɡə] *n* *NAmE*[ˈhæmbɜːrɡər] (also **burg·er**) *noun*

- (*BrE* also **beef·burg·er**) **countable** finely chopped beef made into a flat round shape that is then fried, often served in a bread roll
- (also 'hamburger meat') (both *US*) (*NAmE* also 'ground beef') (*BrE* **mince**) **uncountable** beef that has been finely chopped in a special machine
