1. **uncountable** the act of making sth known or public that was previously secret or private

- The bank will need full disclosure of your financial situation and assets.
- The court ruled to prevent public disclosure of the contents of the documents.

2. **countable** information or a fact that is made known or public that was previously secret or private

Syn: ↑revelation

- startling disclosures about his private life

Word Origin:

late 16th cent.: from ↑disclose, on the pattern of closure.

Example Bank:

- The newspaper's disclosure of defence secrets was condemned as 'irresponsible'.
- There were some startling disclosures about his private life.
