1. **countable** an estimate or a statement of what figures, amounts, or events will be in the future, or what they were in the past, based on what is happening now
  - to make **forward/backward projections** of population figures
  - Sales have exceeded our projections.
  - Calculations are based on a projection of existing trends.

**OF IMAGE**

2. **uncountable, countable** the act of putting an image of sth onto a surface; an image that is shown in this way
  - the projection of three-dimensional images on a computer screen
  - laser projections

**OF SOLID SHAPE**

3. **countable (technical)** a solid shape or object as represented on a flat surface
  - map projections

**STH THAT STICKS OUT**

4. **countable** something that sticks out from a surface
  - tiny projections on the cell

**OF VOICE/SOUND**

5. **uncountable** the act of making your voice, a sound, etc. ↑**audible** (= able to be heard) at a distance
  - voice projection

**PSYCHOLOGY**

6. **uncountable** the act of imagining that sb else is thinking the same as you and is reacting in the same way

**OF THOUGHTS/FEELINGS**

7. **countable, uncountable** the act of giving a form and structure to inner thoughts and feelings
  - The idea of God is a projection of humans' need to have something greater than themselves.

Word Origin:

mid 16th cent. (in sense 3): from Latin **projectio(n)-**, from **proicere** 'throw forth', from **pro-** 'forth' + **jacere** 'to throw'.

Example Bank:

- On current projections, there will be more than fifty million people over 65 in 2020.
- The council has revised its projections of funding requirements upwards.

- The divisions revenue projection is based on net customer growth.
- They presented profit projections for the rest of the year.
- We have been making forward projections as to future profitability of the firm.
