1. [ˈdʒɛpədi] *n*

1. опасность, риск

to be in jeopardy - быть в опасности [*ср. мж.* 2]

to put in jeopardy - подвергать опасности /риску/; ставить под угрозу, рисковать

2. *юр.* подсудность

double jeopardy - вторичное привлечение к уголовной ответственности за то же преступление

a guarantee against double jeopardy - закон, не разрешающий подвергать суду два раза за одно и то же преступление

to be in jeopardy - а) быть обвинённым; б) быть подсудимым [*ср. мж.* 1]

Word Origin:

[**jeopardy**] Middle English iupartī, from Old French **ieu parti** '(evenly) divided game'. The term was originally used in chess and other games to denote a problem, or a position in which the chances of winning or losing were evenly balanced, hence 'a dangerous situation'.
