    - We urgently need more assistance from donor countries (=countries that give money, food etc to help in poor countries or disaster areas).
    - An anonymous donor (=whose name is unknown) has given £500 towards the restoration fund.
  2. someone who gives blood or a body organ so that it can be used in the medical treatment of someone else ⇒ **donate**:
    - Some patients die before a suitable donor is found.

- **a suitable donor** After a 10-month wait, a suitable donor was found.
- **a blood donor** Are you willing to register as a blood donor?
- **an organ donor** There are not nearly enough organ donors.
- **a heart/liver/kidney etc donor** There is a shortage of kidney donors.
- **a sperm/egg donor** (=a man who gives sperm or a woman who gives eggs to help someone else have a baby) Her husband was infertile so they conceived using a sperm donor.

■ **donor + NOUN**

- **a donor organ** She had to wait for over a year before a donor organ became available.
- **a donor heart/liver/kidney etc** The technique keeps the donor heart beating while it is transported.
- **donor blood** Donor blood had to be used during the operation.
- **a donor card** (=that you carry to give permission for your organs to be used if you die) Do you carry a donor card?
