■ adjectives

- **economically developed /advanced** (=modern, with many different types of industry) the economically developed countries of Western Europe
- **economically successful** an economically successful area
- **economically powerful** (=rich and powerful) economically powerful countries like the US
- **economically depressed** (=with not enough business activity, jobs etc) Economically depressed areas in the northeast will receive extra EU funding.
- **economically dependent on** (=depending on someone or something for money) The country is still economically dependent on agriculture.
- **economically viable /feasible** (=likely to be or remain financially successful) Most of the coal mines in the area are no longer economically viable.
- **economically active** (=with a job, and so earning money) A lot of older women are not economically active.
- **economically independent** (=not depending on other people for money) Societies change when women become economically independent.
- **economically disadvantaged** (=poor) Many of our students are from economically disadvantaged backgrounds.

- **develop economically** (=grow and become more economically successful) China is continuing to develop economically and politically.
