un·usual·ly [unusually] *BrE* [ʌn'ju:ʊəli] *NAmE* [ʌn'ju:ʊəli] *BrE* [ʌn'ju:ʊəli]
NAmE [ʌn'ju:ʊəli] **adverb**

- used before adjectives to emphasize that a particular quality is greater than normal
 - unusually high levels of radiation
 - an unusually cold winter
 - The turnout was unusually low.
- used to say that a particular situation is not normal or expected
 - Unusually for him, he wore a tie.

Example Bank:

- She was unusually quiet that evening.
- Unusually for him, he was dressed in a suit.
- an unusually talented designer
