Word Origin:

mid 17th cent.: anglicized form of the Latin imperative quaere!, used in the 16th cent. in English as a verb in the sense 'inquire' and as a noun meaning 'query', from Latin quaerere 'ask, seek'.

- I posted my query on the website and got an immediate reply.
- I've a query to put to the last speaker.
- If you have any queries regarding this offer, simply call our helpline.
- We had queries from people all over the country.
- We regret that we cannot deal with queries on individual cases.
- Have you any queries about what you're supposed to do?
- If you have a query about your policy, contact our helpline.
