After the Exodus (c. 1300 BC) they established the kingdoms of Israel and Judah, and their scriptures and traditions form the basis of the Jewish religion
 - old-fashioned and sometimes offensiveterm for **Jew**
 - 2) the Semitic language of this people, in its ancient or modern form
 2. **He·brew** *adj.*
 - 1) of the Hebrews or the Jews
 - 2) of or in Hebrew
- Origin:**
from Old French *Ebreu*, via Latin from late Greek *Hebraios*, from Aramaic *ʾibrāy*, based on Hebrew *ʾibrî* understood to mean 'one from the other side (of the river).'
