- The movie will have its premiere in July.

Word Origin:
 late 19th cent.: French **première**, feminine of **premier** 'first', from Latin **primarius** 'principal'.

- Example Bank:
- He conducted the world premiere of the symphony.
 - London hosted the star-studded premiere of 'Harry Potter'.
 - The movie receives its American premiere on November 16.
 - The opera was given its premiere by the New York City Opera.
 - They attended the premiere together.
 - the movie's premiere party
 - the premiere episode of 'Angel'
 - the premiere issue of a new journal
 - the stage premiere of John Adams's opera
 - He was unable to attend the world premiere of his new play.

verb transitive, intransitive ~ (sth)
 to perform a play or piece of music or show a film/movie to an audience for the first time; to be performed or shown to an audience for the first time

- The play was premiered at the Birmingham Rep in 2008.
- His new movie premieres in New York this week.

 the first public performance of a film, play, or piece of music:

- Rossini's work had its premiere at the Paris Opera.
- a movie premiere
- the play's world premiere (=the first performance in the world)

—**premiere** *verb* [intransitive and transitive]:
 • The movie premiered on December 21, 1937.

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
