- verb (ski-ing, skied, skied)**
- 1. **intransitive (+ adv./prep.)** to move over snow on ↑skis, especially as a sport
 - How well do you ski?
 - We skied down the slope one by one.
 - 2. **go skiing intransitive** to spend time ↑skiing for pleasure
 - We went skiing in France in March.

 - a ski resort (=where people can go skiing)
