Syn: ↑perspective

- a **political/theoretical , etc. standpoint**
- He is writing **from the standpoint** of someone who knows what life is like in prison.

Example Bank:

- We must approach the problem from a different standpoint.
- We should try to adopt a more positive standpoint.
- From a practical standpoint, there's a desperate need for cheaper housing.
- He has written the book from the standpoint of someone who has experienced political persecution.
- This is a purely theoretical standpoint that has no basis in reality.
