1. **intransitive, transitive ~ (sth) (with sth)** to arrange sth in the correct position, or to be in the correct position, in relation to sth else, especially in a straight line
  - Make sure the shelf is aligned with the top of the cupboard.
  - The top and bottom line of each column on the page should align.
2. **transitive ~ sth (with/to sth)** to change sth slightly so that it is in the correct relationship to sth else
  - Domestic prices have been aligned with those in world markets.

Example Bank:

- The group does not want to align itself too closely with the government

1. **[transitive]** to publicly support a political group, country, or person that you agree with  
**align yourself with somebody/something**
  - Church leaders have aligned themselves with the opposition.
  - a country closely aligned with the West
2. **[intransitive and transitive]** to arrange things so that they form a line or are parallel to each other, or to be in a position that forms a line etc:
  - The desks were neatly aligned in rows.
  - Make sure that all the holes align.
3. **[transitive usually passive]** to organize or change something so that it has the right relationship to something else  
**align with**
  - This policy is closely aligned with the goals of the organization.
