- 2) вещественный, материальный

2. [ˈbɒdɪli] *adv*

1. лично, собственной персоной
 he came bodily - он явился сам /лично/
2. 1) целиком
 the building was transported bodily to another place - всё здание целиком было передвинуто в другое место
 the audience rose bodily - все присутствующие встали; все встали как один человек
 they resigned bodily - они в полном составе подали в отставку
- 2) *mex.* в собранном виде

2. in one piece; completely
 - The monument was moved bodily to a new site.
