- Apply the wallpaper paste with a roller.
- Mix the flour with enough water to form a thick paste.
- Mix the sugar mixture to a smooth paste.

**verb**

1. **transitive ~ sth + adv./prep.** to stick sth to sth else using glue or <sup>↑</sup>paste
  - He pasted the pictures into his scrapbook.
  - Paste the two pieces together.
  - Paste down the edges.
2. **transitive ~ sth** to make sth by sticking pieces of paper together
  - The children were busy cutting and pasting paper hats.
3. **transitive, intransitive ~ (sth) (computing)** to copy or move text into a document from another place or another document
  - This function allows you to **cut and paste** text.
  - It's quicker to cut and paste than to retype.
