- transitive** ~ **sth** to share or exchange ideas, information, etc
 - Cable technology will make it possible for people to interchange information on a rapid two-way basis.
- transitive, intransitive** to put each of two things or people in the other's place; to move or be moved from one place to another in this way
 - ~ **A and B** to interchange the front and rear tyres of a car
 - ~ **(A) (with B)** to interchange the front tyres with the rear ones
 - The front and rear tyres interchange (= can be exchanged).
