that will subtract nothing from his merit - это отнюдь не умаляет его заслуг

mid 16th cent.: from Latin **subtract-** 'drawn away', from **sub-** 'from below' + **trahere** 'to draw'.

Example Bank:

- 6 subtracted from 9 is 3.
- If you subtract 6 from 9, you get 3.
