 disrespect to the flag - оскорбление флага  
 to treat smb. with disrespect - относиться к кому-л. без должного уважения /неуважительно/

 относиться без уважения, пренебрежительно, непочтительно

## disrespect

**noun uncountable, countable** ~ (for/to sb/sth)

- a lack of respect for sb/sth
- disrespect for the law/the dead
  - No disrespect intended** sir. It was just a joke.

Example Bank:

- No disrespect intended sir; it was just a joke.
- She felt he had total disrespect for women.
- The new manager showed a healthy disrespect for formality.
- They have shown a total disrespect for the law.

**verb ~ sb/sth (informal)**

to speak about or treat sb/sth without respect

- They were accused of disrespecting the country's flag.
- He denied disrespecting the disaster victims.
- The teachers' dedication has been ignored or disrespecting.
- Don't disrespect what I believe in. Some people consider that it is not correct to use **disrespect** as a verb, and that you should use the noun instead, especially in formal and written English
- They were accused of treating the country's flag with disrespect.

- No disrespect to Phil, but the team has performed better since he left (=used to show you are not criticizing someone).
