Word Origin:

[**immaculate** **immaculately**] late Middle English (in the sense 'free from moral stain'): from Latin *immaculatus*, from *in-* 'not' + *maculatus* 'stained' (from *macula* 'spot').

- The suit he was wearing was immaculate.
- Though old, the books were in immaculate condition.
