 - (*NAmE*) (**BrE con·ser·va·toire**) a school or college at which people are trained in music and theatre

Word Origin:

mid 16th cent. (denoting something that preserves): from late Latin **conservatorium**, from **conservare** ‘to preserve’, from **con-** ‘together’ + **servare** ‘to keep’.
