1. (*NAmE* also **shell**) a tube or case containing **↑explosive** and a bullet or **↑shot**, for shooting from a gun
2. a case containing sth that is used in a machine, for example film for a camera, ink for a printer, etc. **Cartridges** are put into the machine and can be removed and replaced when they are finished or empty.
3. a thin tube containing ink which you put inside a pen
 - See also: **↑shell**

late 16th cent.: from French **cartouche** (feminine noun), from Italian **cartoccio**, from **carta**, from Latin **carta**, **charta**, from Greek **khartēs** 'papyrus leaf'.
