1. (*NAmE*) a blow, especially one that causes slight damage to a car, etc
• I got a ding in my rear fender.
2. used to represent the sound made by a bell
• The lift came to a halt with a loud 'ding'.

verb

1. **intransitive** to make a sound like a bell
• The computer just dings when I press a key.
2. **transitive ~ sth** (*NAmE*) to cause slight damage to a car, etc
• I dinged my passenger door.
3. **transitive ~ sb** (*NAmE*) to hit sb: (*figurative*) My department got dinged by the budget cuts.
