 - Factory chimneys spewed fumes out into the sky.
 - spew from/into/over etc**
 - Brown water spewed from the tap.
- [intransitive always + adverb/preposition, transitive]** (*also spew out/forth*) to say a lot of bad or negative things very quickly:
 - Groups like these use the Internet to spew racial hatred.
- [intransitive and transitive]** (*also spew up*) *informal* to **↑vomit**
