a cutback in orders [in production] - сокращение заказов [производства]
- 1) смещение событий, нарушение последовательности событий (*в рассказе*)  
2) *КИНО* «обратный кадр», монтажная перебивка  
cutbacks to the hero's youth - кадры, возвращающие зрителя к молодости героя

- The shortage of teachers was blamed on government cutbacks.

**cutback in**

- cutbacks in funding libraries
- A fall in donations has forced the charity to make cutbacks.

**sharp/drastring/severe cutback**

- sharp cutbacks in the military budget
