- лишать права; дисквалифицировать (мж. спорт.)  
to disqualify smb. for the Olympic games - лишить кого-л. права участвовать в Олимпийских играх  
to disqualify smb. from driving - ≅ отобрать у кого-л. водительские права  
to disqualify women from such careers as diplomacy - лишать женщин возможности работать в таких областях, как дипломатия
- 1) лишать возможности; делать негодным, неспособным  
this alone would disqualify him for the position - уже одно это делает его неподходящим для данного поста  
2) юр. лишать права, поражать в правах
