noun

a long piece of strong cloth with a pole on each side, used for carrying sb who is sick or injured and who cannot walk

- He was carried off on a stretcher.
- stretcher cases (= people too badly injured to be able to walk)

verb ~ sb + adv./prep. usually passive

to carry sb somewhere on a ↑stretcher

- He was stretchered off the pitch with a broken leg.
- She was stretchered into the waiting ambulance.
