**jut** [jut juts juttet jutting] *BrE* [dʒʌt] <sup>u</sup> *NAmE* [dʒʌt] <sup>u</sup> verb (-tt-) **intransitive, transitive**

to stick out further than the surrounding surface, objects, etc; to make sth stick out

**Syn:** ↑protrude, **Syn:** ↑project

- ~ **(out) (from, into, over sth)** A row of small windows jutted out from the roof.
- A rocky headland jutted into the sea.
- a jutting chin
- ~ **sth (out)** She jutted her chin out stubbornly.

**jut** /dʒʌt/ *BrE* <sup>u</sup> *AmE* <sup>u</sup> (also **jut out**) verb (past tense and past participle **juttet**, present participle **jutting**)

[Date: 1500-1600; Origin: ⇨ ↑jet<sup>2</sup> 'to stick out' (16-18 centuries)]

- 1. [**intransitive** always + adverb/preposition] something that juts out sticks out further than the other things around it:  
Tall jagged rocks jutted out over the beach.
- 2. [**transitive**] if you jut your chin out, you move it so that it sticks forward:  
She jutted her chin out aggressively as she glowered back at him.
