Word Origin:

late Middle English (in sense 2): from late Latin **depreciat- 'lowered in price, undervalued'**, from the verb **depreciare**, from Latin **de- 'down'** + **pretium 'price'**.

Example Bank:

- Cars depreciate in value rapidly.
- Sterling is expected to depreciate against the dollar.
- The peso depreciated by 9%.
- The rupee depreciated by 9 per cent.
