Word Origin:late Middle English: from Old French **amenite** or Latin **amoenitas**, from **amoenus** 'pleasant'.Example Bank:

- The building will be developed as a public amenity.

- The flats lacked basic amenities.
- The hotel has excellent amenities.
- They will provide an amenity for local residents.
- a hotel with all modern amenities
- the diverse cultural amenities of cities
