Word Origin:early 20th cent. (originally in the French form): from French *évacué*, past participle of *évacuer*, from Latin *evacuare*, from *e-* (variant of *ex-*) 'out of' + *vacuus* 'empty'.Example Bank:

- Allowances were available to cover the cost of hosting an evacuee.
- During 1942 evacuee families started to arrive in the town.
