Word Origin:

late 18th cent. (as a noun): from French **conscrit**, from Latin **conscriptus**, past participle of **conscribere** 'enrol'. The verb is a back-formation from ↑**conscription**.

noun *BrE* [ˈkɒnskript] ^ˈ; *NAmE* [ˈkɑːnskript] ^ˈ (especially BrE) (US usually **draft-ee**)

a person who has been **conscripted** to join the armed forces
