Word Origin:

[**cardiac**] late Middle English (as a noun denoting heart disease): from French **cardiaque** or Latin **cardiacus**, from Greek **kardiakos**, from **kardia** 'heart or upper opening of the stomach'. The adjective dates from the early 17th cent.
