Word Origin:

mid 17th cent. (in the sense 'resembling a crown'): from Latin **coronarius**, from **corona** 'wreath, crown'.

if someone has a coronary, their heart suddenly stops working because the flow of blood to it has been blocked by a small piece of solid blood **SYN heart attack**
