All these words can be used to refer to a place where legal trials take place. **Court** and (formal) **court of law** usually refer to the actual room where cases are judged. **Courtroom** is also used for this. **Law court** (*BrE*) is more often used to refer to the building: The prison is opposite the law court. **Courthouse** is used for this in *NAmE*.

Example Bank:

• The prison is opposite the courthouse.
