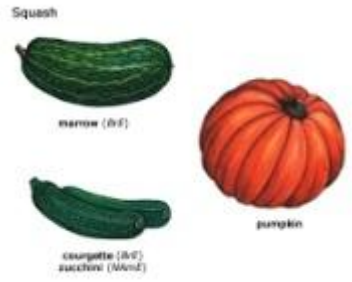

Old English mearg, mærg (in sense 1), of Germanic origin; related to Dutch *merg* and German *Mark*. Sense 2 dates from the early 19th cent.
