Word Origin:

late Middle English (denoting an ecclesiastical pastor, also (still a Scots legal term) the guardian of a minor): from Old French *curateur* or, in later use, directly from Latin *curator*, from *curare* 'take care of', from *cura* 'care'. The current sense dates from the mid 17th cent.
