- the inaugural flight of the space shuttle

Word Origin:

[**inaugural**] late 17th cent.: from French (from **inaugurer** 'inaugurate', from Latin **inaugurare**) + **↑-al**.

Example Bank:

- The President delivered his inaugural address after being sworn in for a second term.
- the professor's inaugural lecture

▪ **II. in-aug-ural** **noun countable, usually singular** (especially *NAmE*)

- the presidential inaugural in January
